## Feast of St. Michael, Archangel November 8th

The Christian life is a struggle between the forces of good and evil. Peace of mind is an invaluable spiritual gift. One's spiritual well-being and salvation of soul are of paramount importance.

God's constant care for us who were made in the image and likeness of God is unending. In the Divine Liturgy before the Lord's Prayer, Our Father, the priest prays for the protection of a guardian angel." The prayer reads: "an angel of peace, a faithful guide, a guardian of our souls and bodies, let us ask the Lord."

According to sacred church tradition, God gives his guardian angels to every person on the day of baptism, as well as to every city and country. There are, for example, patrons of doctors, teachers, drivers, etc. There is much evidence of how guardian angels have saved the lives and health of many people

The Holy Apostle and Evangelist John writes about St. Michael the Archangel: "And there was war in heaven: Michael and his angels fought against the dragon... and the great dragon was cast down, that ancient serpent, called the Devil, Satan, was cast down to the earth "(Rev 12: 7-9). From our Catechism, It is known that some of the angels, led by Lucifer, rebelled against God, but the archangel Michael, whose name means "who is like God," stayed on the side of God and defeated by God's power the unfaithful angels, the devils. Sacred Scripture tells us that many angels under the leadership of Michael remained faithful: "I have seen and heard the voice of many angels round about the throne, and there were many multitudes and thousands of thousands" (Rev 5:11).

The Holy Church teaches us that angels do exist. The Church clearly teaches that each person has a Guardian Angel who takes care of that person whom the Lord has entrusted.

Jesus Christ Himself says, " Do not look down on any of these little ones. For I tell you that in heaven their angels are always in the presence of My heavenly Father." (Mt 18:10).

We also have the testimony of the early Church Fathers. Saint Basil the Great writes: "No one will deny that every believer has his Guardian Angel." St. John Chrysostom says similarly: "Each of us has an Angel. St. Michael the Archangel helps us in our spiritual battle against evil. He can keep us on the path to salvation, to Heaven

As we reflect on the ministry of angels for our salvation, we ask today our Heavenly Patrons and Guardians of our lives, the holy angels, to bind us to the path of our salvation. Let us remember that there is nothing more terrible than the eternal destruction of the soul, so let us try to enter into the eternal joy of our Lord with the help of a guardian angel! We ask our guardian angels to continue to protect us all the days of our lives. May the angels lead us confidently to the eternal joy and peace of God in Heaven!

## Today's Scripture is about identity. It is about the identity of the possessed man, and it is about our identity.

How often do we define ourselves in terms of our limitations, our setbacks, our disappointments, our failures? We do it often enough to rob ourselves of the abundant life God hopes we will experience and share. Am I the only one to be reminded of every failure, every disappointment that I have experienced before, as I try something new? We tend to allow our failures and disappointments to control us. We are not all that different from the possessed man; we too are Legion.

This story is really about identity. The Gerasene man Jesus encounters lost his identity amid the legion of demons, but Jesus gave it back to him. Jesus gives us our identity as well. At our baptism we are washed with water, marked with the cross of Christ, and sealed with the Holy Spirit forever.

Today's reading is powerful, because it dares to call so many of the identities imposed upon us a lie and invites us to revel in the God-given identity of being a beloved child of God, worthy of love, honour, and respect.

# Why Remember?

*We must remember. If we do not, the sacrifice of those one hundred thousand Canadian lives will be meaningless. They died for us, for their homes and families and friends, for a collection of traditions they cherished and a future they believed in; they died for Canada. The meaning of their sacrifice rests with our collective national consciousness; our future is their monument.*

These wars touched the lives of Canadians of all ages, all races, all social classes. Fathers, sons, daughters, sweethearts: they were killed in action, they were wounded, and thousands who returned were forced to live the rest of their lives with the physical and mental scars of war. The people who stayed in Canada also served—in factories, in voluntary service organizations, wherever they were needed.

Yet for many of us, war is a phenomenon seen through the lens of a television camera or a journalist's account of fighting in distant parts of the world. Our closest physical and emotional experience may be the discovery of wartime memorabilia in a family attic. But even items such as photographs, uniform badges, medals, and diaries can seem vague and unconnected to the life of their owner. For those of us born during peacetime, all wars seem far removed from our daily lives.

We often take for granted our Canadian values and institutions, our freedom to participate in cultural and political events, and our right to live under a government of our choice. The Canadians who went off to war in distant lands went in the belief that the values and beliefs enjoyed by Canadians were being threatened. They truly believed that *"Without freedom there can be no ensuring peace and without peace no enduring freedom."*<sup>2</sup>

By remembering their service and their sacrifice, we recognize the tradition of freedom these men and women fought to preserve. They believed that their actions in the present would make a significant difference for the future, but it is up to us to ensure that their dream of peace is realized. On Remembrance Day, we acknowledge the courage and sacrifice of those who served their country and acknowledge our responsibility to work for the peace they fought hard to achieve.

During times of war, individual acts of heroism occur frequently; only a few are ever recorded and receive official recognition. By remembering all who have served, we recognize their willingly-endured hardships and fears, taken upon themselves so that we could live in peace.
