Blessed Olga (Olha), Princess of Kyiv

Olga (Church Slavonic: Ольга; Old Norse: *Helga*; Christian name: *Elena*; c. 890–925 – 969) was a regent of Kievan Rus' for her son Sviatoslav from 945 until 960. Following her baptism, Olga took the name Elena,¹ She is known for her subjugation of the Drevlians, a tribe that had killed her husband Igor of Kiev. Even though it would be her grandson Vladimir that would convert the entire nation to Christianity, because of her efforts to spread Christianity through Rus', Olga is venerated as a saint in the Eastern Orthodox Church with the epithet "Equal to the Apostles" and her feast day is 11 July.^[2]

The miraculous Byzantine Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help was entrusted to the Redemptorist Fathers in 1865 by Pope Pius IX and. ever since, they have been successfully promoting devotion to the Virgin Mary through that beautiful image. The traditional day for venerating Our Lady of Perpetual Help for many has been June 27. On that same day in 2001, Pope St. John Paul II declared as 'Blessed' 27* Martyrs that had given their lives for Christ in the Soviet Communist years. This might cause a chal-

lenge to a community that wanted to adequately honour both the Blessed Virgin and the new martyrs. Whatever the reason for the Synodal decision to establish a unique feast day for Our Lady of Perpetual Help, the decree does not go into details expect to state that it should take place annually "on the first Sunday of the month of July". .

If You Want to Change, Then Face the Truth

“You have heard about Jesus and have learned the truth that comes from him.” Ephesians 4:21

The secret to personal change is not willpower. The secret is to know and face the truth. So, if you want to change, you must know and face the truth about yourself and your nature.

The Bible teaches that personal change starts with truth. The truth sets you free. The apostle Paul says, *“You have heard about Jesus and have learned the truth that comes from him”* Ephesians 4:21.

Who is the truth? It’s Jesus. And because Jesus is the truth, he will always tell you the truth. His Word is the truth. The Bible is his Word, and that means the Bible is truth. You can read more about that in 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

What you hear on television or read in books won’t always help you—because it’s not always the truth. In fact, if you consistently listen to what voices around you are saying, you’ll find your life built on a foundation of lies, misconceptions, deceptions, and half-truths. And you will never change.

But what God tells you is always the truth. God’s Word shows you how to get back to the life you were created to live, and then it shows you how to stay on God’s path. This is why it is so important for you to have a daily quiet time in the Word of God. Nothing will change until you get the truth into your heart.

Choose today to face and respond to the truth. Then you’ll begin to see positive change in your life.
