Blessing of the Acolyte Candles Sunday, August 11th after the 9 am Divine Liturgy at Holy Family Church



The Ukrainian liturgical year, particularly within the context of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church and the Ukrainian Orthodox Church, is rich in traditions and observances. Here's an overview of its structure and key elements:

1. Liturgical Calendar: The Ukrainian liturgical year is divided into several seasons, each with its own significance and observances:

- **Great Lent** (Vyshnyi Post): A period of fasting and repentance leading up to Pascha (Easter).

- **Holy Week:** The week preceding Pascha, filled with various services commemorating the events of Christ's Passion.

- **Pascha (Easter):** The celebration of the Resurrection of Christ, the central feast of the Christian faith.
